

# Patterns 2GO

## Child's Knit Scarf

This scarf is made of just two basic knitting stitches – knit and purl – yet makes an attractive design, and is an easy project for the beginner knitter.



### Materials Needed:

2 - 1-oz balls of 3 or 4 ply knitting wool in color of your choice  
1 Pair size 7 Knitting needles

### Abbreviations:

K (knit)      p (purl)  
St (stitch)

These 12 rows form the pattern for the scarf. Repeat rows 1 through 12

Cast on 36 sts and k in pattern as follows:

Row 1: K 4, p 4, repeat across row.

Row 2: P 4, k 4, repeat across row.

Row 3: Repeat row 1.

Row 4: Repeat row 2.

Row 5: Repeat row 1.

Row 6: Repeat row 2.

Row 7: Alternate by working 4 p over the 4 k sts of previous row, and k 4 over the 4 p sts.

Row 8: K 4, p 4, repeat across row.

Row 9: P 4, k 4, repeat across row.

Row 10: Repeat row 8.

Row 11: Repeat row 9.

Row 12: Repeat row 8.

until piece measures about 36 inches in length. Bind off.

FRINGE: Cut desired number of strands of yarn (about 5 inches long). Fold the strands in half to form a loop. Insert crochet hook through stitch at edge of scarf and

draw loop through. Pull loose ends through loop; then pull ends down tight to make a knot. Repeat across each end. Trim ends evenly.
